Petar I Karadjordjević (1844-1921)

He was the king of Serbia from 1903 to 1918 and the king of the Serbs, Croats and Slovenes from 1918 to 1921.



Milunka Savić (1892-1973)

She was a Serbian heroine of the Balkan Wars and the First World War, a corporal in the Second Regiment of the Serbian Army "Knjaz Mihailo", as well as the woman with the most decorations in the history of warfare.



Radomir Putnik (1847-1917)

During his rich military career, he was twice Chief of the General Staff, five times Minister of Defense and Chief of Staff of the Supreme Command of the Army of the Kingdom of Serbia in the Balkans and the First World War.



Živojin Mišić (1855-1921)

Was a Serbian and Yugoslav Field Marshal.


At the very beginning of his forty-year service, he was a participant in the Serbian-Turkish wars (1876-1878). During WW1 he was one of the most brilliant Serbian

Commanders.



Petar Bojović (1858-1945)

▶ In the First Balkan War, Bojović was the Chief of Staff of the First Army from October 1912. He stood out during the battles of Kumanovo and Bitola, after which he received the rank of general. At the end of WW1 he was promoted to Field Marshal for his military achievements.



Stepa Stepanović (1856-1929)

► He participated in the Serbian-Turkish wars (1876-1878), Balkan Wars and WW1. After the Battle of Cer he became the second Field Marshal of the Serbian Army.
