1) Živojin Mišić (1855-1921)

Živojin Mišić was a Field Marshal who participated in all of Serbia's wars from 1876 to 1918. He directly commanded the First Serbian Army in the Battle of Kolubara and in the breach of the Salonika Front. He was the Chief of the Supreme Command. He is the most decorated Serbian military officer in history.



2) Milunka Savić (1892-1973)

Milunka Savić was a Serbian war heroine who fought in the Balkan Wars and in World War I. She is the most-decorated female combatant in the recorded history of warfare.



3) Petar Bojović (1858-1945)

Petar Bojović was a Serbian military commander who fought in the Serbo-Bulgarian War, the First Balkan War, the Second Balkan War, World War I and World War II. Following the Salonika Front he was promoted to fourth Field Marshal.



4) Petar I Karađorđević (1844-1921)

Petar I Karađorđević was the last king of Serbia, reigning from 15 June 1903 to 1 December 1918. On 1 December 1918, he became the first king of the Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, and he held that title until his death three years later. Since he was the king of Serbia during a period of great Serbian military success, he was remembered by the Serbian people as King Petar the Liberator, and also as Old King.
